

Allen Gardiner



Allen Francis Gardiner was born in 1794, to wealthy parents in Oxfordshire. He became an officer in the Royal Navy and had a distinguished career. After the end of the Napoleonic wars, he returned as an invalid in 1822.

Perhaps as a result of his naval adventures, he had long considered becoming a missionary first in Africa among the Zulu, then among the indigenous peoples of Chile (1838–1843). During this time, he founded the *South American Missionary Society*, SAMS.

A later expedition to the Falkland Islands failed, and all the expedition starved to death. Gardiner was the last survivor and probably died on this day in 1851.

A reading from St Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians

When any of you has a grievance against another, do you dare to take it to court before the unrighteous, instead of taking it before the saints? Do you not know that the saints will judge the world? And if the world is to be judged by you, are you incompetent to try trivial cases? Do you not know that we are to judge angels—to say nothing of ordinary matters? If you have ordinary cases, then, do you appoint as judges those who have no standing in the church? I say this to your shame. Can it be that there is no one among you wise enough to decide between one believer and another, but a believer goes to court against a believer—and before unbelievers at that?

In fact, to have lawsuits at all with one another is already a defeat for you. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be defrauded? But you yourselves wrong and defraud—and believers at that.

Do you not know that wrongdoers will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived! Fornicators, idolaters, adulterers, male prostitutes, sodomites, thieves, the greedy, drunkards, revilers, robbers—none of these will inherit the kingdom of God. And this is what some of you used to be. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God. *1 Corinthians 6:1–11*

Gospel reading

Sermon

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

There used to be a phrase, perhaps some people still use it, 'in the mission field'. Such and such a person or family, is 'in the mission field'. This is exactly what we are remembering Allen Gardiner for today, people who left hearth and home and went to other countries and peoples, to preach the gospel. They were and are fulfilling the Great Commission found at the end of Matthew's gospel 'Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.' It was felt that anyone who died unbaptised and unconverted was in danger of their immortal soul, therefore persuading non-Christians of the truth of the gospel was imperative. This is what encouraged Allen Gardiner to South Africa and South America, like many others at the time, his efforts to convert the peoples living in these places were unsuccessful in his lifetime.

But, this may make us question what 'success' looks like, because although he himself saw no obvious fruit of his missions, the organisation he founded the *South American Mission Society* or SAMS is still active and still working among the people of South America. The small seed Allen Gardiner planted is flourishing and there are still people 'in the mission field' continuing his work.

We may these days be more wary of emphasising the conversion of non-Christians above other elements of mission but the Christian imperative to work with the poor and marginalised remains the same. And did you notice what you've just read? The poor and marginalised. We know that across the world millions, if not, hundreds of millions of people are living in extreme poverty, trying to exist on less than two dollars a day. Yet, we also know that there are increasing numbers of people in this country who are slipping into poverty; children who go to bed hungry, families and the elderly worried about heating their home, people who can't afford to rent or buy a decent place to live and so become homeless. The

missionaries of today don't need to go very far at all to find 'a mission field', because the 'mission field' is all around us.

People like Allen Gardiner can be inspirations to us, they can even, perhaps, be called heroes of the faith, but the work he did in remote places is needed just as much in our own towns, cities, and streets. The work of evangelization is as necessary to day as it ever was. Faith in Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour is on the decline in this country, in fact some countries now send missionaries to the UK to teach and persuade, but as important as conversion is serving.

Allen Gardiner's organisation SAMS now provides services for those who can't afford them for themselves, and in this way demonstrates the love of God practically as well as speaking of the love of God to those who need to hear of it. We are also called to this kind of mission. Our 'mission field' is most probably to those around us. The principle is the same, it's just the place that's different.

There are, I'm sure, plenty of people we could attempt to 'convert', or more help-fully put, speak to about the love of God. Friends, neighbours, work colleagues? There are, definitely, many people in our communities who are in need of what we would once have called Christian charity. The local foodbank? A local charity trying to help the homeless or struggling families? How far are we prepared to go to help? Are we ourselves prepared to sacrifice a simple comfort or treat in order to help by donating the money it would have cost? Again, consider the sacrifice those missionaries of the past who left home for years on end with a real prospect of dying in the process.

The idea of our own particular and personal mission is for us to take to God in prayer, but we should absolutely believe and know that we have a mission in the world, we have a field in which God is asking us to work. We have people to speak to and people we can help. This is the essence of missionary work, in that as I've said, we are no different form Allen Gardiner, less glamorous and less exotic, but equally important.

The last thing I want to say is that Allen Gardiner didn't settle and become comfortable. He moved from South Africa to South American looking for new opportunities. We should look to do the same. God calls God's people onward into new pastures, into new insights and new visions for mission and service. Getting too comfortable in our service to others, or our hope to share the gospel is never helpful. With missionaries like Allen Gardiner, we should be on the look out for the next opportunity, the next person the next act of charity.
