Gospel reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

All Glory to you O Lord.

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' He replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.' *Luke 23:33–43*

Sermon

What sort of a King is our King Jesus?

An *expected* **King** Genesis 49:10 The sceptre shall not depart from Judah nor the ruler's staff from his feet until he comes to whom it belongs and the obedience of the nations is his.

Jacob's dying promises to his sons include this interesting comment to Judah there is one coming to whom the rule belongs – here from years back comes the promise of one to come who is special and amazing

A *celebrated* King On Palm Sunday the people celebrate and recognise and adore the King come among them. Jesus shows every prophesied mark of the expected King and the Hosannas ring—here he is, he's come, now things will be different. Now our dreams will be met, now God will rule and we will be vindicated.

A *disappointing* King But after 5 days of this King they crucify him. What changed? Well they didn't want this King to be *that* different. The trouble is our expectations so often—we say we want God's rule but he has to change the things we want changed, do things our way or ... we will have none of this King. Note the comments by people at the crucifixion from our Gospel reading today. And note also that in the temptations in the desert Jesus has already rejected the Kingdom of human rule and wealth and glory for the path God has set before him.

What these people want is an end to foreign rule, the Romans driven into the sea, Israel restored and in charge of its own destiny (a terrible phrase that has spawned much evil—always watch for it in political rhetoric!). Have any of them asked what God wants? Have any taken note of the scriptures of the Suffering Servant and wondered? No because us humans are good at wanting what we want and now.

Simon bar-Kochba was the leader of the third and last Jewish rebellion against the Romans, proclaimed Messiah by many of his people and the end result was the catastrophic destruction of the nation and the scattering of the Jews. So much for military power. 200 years later the emperor was a Christian! Whose kingdom won, I wonder

What our God is after is a Kingdom where the wounded and the powerless and the failures find in Him a presence and a power and a grace that turns the world upside down. Where violence is rejected, where earthly power is not desired, where God is followed to the uttermost.

The *coming* **King** But there's more! There is coming a Day, a day when the Kingdom comes in power, when sin and death and evil are destroyed to rise no more. A day when rule rests in God alone, grace and power made manifest, love wins.

Let us work and witness that that Day may come and finally that 'the Lamb might receive the reward of his suffering'.

Eucharistic Prayer (prayer E)

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.
