Gospel reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

All Glory to you O Lord.

Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognising him. And he said to them, 'What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?' They stood still, looking sad. Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, 'Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?' He asked them, 'What things?' They replied, 'The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came

back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him.' Then he said to them, 'Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?' Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, 'Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.' So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognised him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?' That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, 'The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!' Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread. *Luke 24:13–35*

Sermon

The Passover is over. But the shock of what has happened, the extent of the loss, the awfulness of the suffering of their friend remains. It's time to go home, to leave after all the investment of energy and love and hope—and it's all ended in blood and tears and death. The only thing left is to go back to the old way of life, to settle to normal instead of extraordinary, to find some way of rebuilding.

The hills are steep enough anyway but today they seem like cliffs. Heavy hearted and heavy legged they take the familiar track. But the memories of the last two years and the last three days echo around their hearts and they try and talk it out as they go—but there are no answers but disappointment and loss. They take a dark cloud with them, it seems.

Do we know who they are, these two travellers? Well Cleopas is one of them— I always like it when Luke names people because I reckon he's basically saying to his first readers 'And you can go and ask him yourself'—*these* are his witnesses. It is possible that Mary Clopas, one of the women at the Cross was his wife – in which

case maybe this is the couple travelling home together. They've been part of the travelling circle of friends and supporters of Jesus—perhaps part of the seventy, perhaps wider travelling companions but close enough to have dreams and hopes, to invest in this wonderful Man.

This sheds a light on the Easter events from the perspective of those close to Jesus. They didn't expect his resurrection! Every attitude of them all screams that the Cross ended it all—all the doubting, all the hiding, all the grief and now the heavy-footed trudge of broken witnesses giving up and going home. There were 2 schools of thought at the time—the Sadducees didn't expect a resurrection – now or future and for them this is it. The Pharisees expected resurrection but at the last day when we are called to Judgement—note in the story of the raising of Lazarus this is what Martha expects after the death of her brother—nothing now. So when the stranger walking near them interjects and starts teaching them the pall of depression and loss and the whole unexpectedness of it hides who he is.

He is recognised in the breaking of bread! And their world shifts again. Instead of a heavy trudge home they rush back to Jerusalem to find they are not the first but can confirm—Jesus is risen from the dead. He's alive. And whatever men may say for them life will never be the same, life will never be the same again.

I wonder where you're at this morning? What has life dealt you? Are you trudging your way with little hope or expectation, with no dreams any more? There will be good reasons to feel like that—life can kick us in the teeth and our worlds can turn grey and cloudy. Today you have a companion on that road. Today there is someone, vaguely familiar maybe, don't I recognise that voice, with us in our trudge. Will we let him renew and restore us? He is waiting for that moment of recognition, that welcome and return to joy. He is alive, life has lost an end, we have a welcome in his heart and home and hope beyond our wildest dreams if only we will let him in to change us.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.
