

StAthanasius



Athanasius was born in about the year 296 AD of Christian parents and educated at the Catechetical school in Alexandria. He was present at the Council of Nicaea as a deacon, accompanying his bishop Alexander, whom he succeeded as Patriarch in the year 328 AD. Athanasius held firmly to the doctrines of the Church as defined by that Council and became the leader of those opposed to the teachings of Arian, which denied the divinity of Christ. He was deposed from—and restored to—his See several times because of his uncompromising faith. In or out of exile, Athanasius continued his writings. He always championed orthodoxy over heresy and the essential need for the Church to teach the true doctrines of the faith rather than anything that anything appearing to be a watered-down version of it. He was a strong believer in asceticism as a means of restoring the divine image in humanity and thus a supporter of monasticism, which was in its nascent state at that time.

He was a friend of Pachomius and wrote the *Life of Antony of Egypt*, which showed the cenobitic life as holding a balance between things earthly and heavenly. He died on this day in the year 373 AD.

Sermon

Athanasius came to church leadership at a vital time. There had been a vicious persecution of the church just before Constantine became emperor and brought Christianity to the centre of empire life. That persecution resulted in some people coming to powerful positions in the church who had less than orthodox views on the nature of Christ—in particular a man named Arius from Alexandria who denied the divinity of our Lord. In part this was an intent to celebrate his humanity but it succeeded only, in its formulation, in splitting the church into factions.

The first consequence was the slightly unsatisfactory Council of Nicaea, called by Constantine to bring unity to the church and resolve the questions. It got rather bogged down in debates of subtle Greek phrases although its definite conclusion was the orthodox position of the divinity and humanity of Christ being both essential for salvation and the revelation of scripture.

Unfortunately, the Arian groups failed to back the council's conclusions and central to the debates over most of the rest of his life is Athanasius—exiled from his see but continuing to write and argue for the truth. Perhaps sometimes his rhetoric didn't help his cause but his passion for the truth of who Jesus is was everything to him.

Why does it matter so much? It's not some esoteric debate about theoretical philosophical stuff. It speaks to the heart of salvation. If Jesus is limited in nature, then his sacrifice is limited in effect—it cannot save to the uttermost and we end up struggling and failing to be holy so that we may be saved. Interestingly, Athanasius wrote a history of Anthony of Egypt who started the hermetic/monastic life that influenced so many. One of the discoveries of monasticism is that however far we may go to escape the world and its sinfulness, we can never ever escape our own capacity to fail and fall short of God and his standards. That's why we need a Saviour who has the answer to the mess we make of our own lives and our own hearts—and Jesus the man who bears unspoilt humanity before God and who by his divinity pays the price for the sins of the whole world has the answer we need. Only He can make it possible for even one such as I with all the mistakes and sins and failures I bear to find the amazing love of God and receive the great grace of a welcome to his heart and home—me adopted as his child. Wow!

This is the place where Christianity rises above all other faiths in the world and in history. Only in Christ are failures saved to the uttermost; only here is there an answer for sinners. Here is the full remarkable love of God made manifest that whoever who calls on his name will be saved—not because we deserve it but because Jesus saw our need and was willing to go to the uttermost for our sake. How we love him!

Eucharistic Prayer (prayer E)

The Lord be with you

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. And now we give thanks, most gracious God, surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses and glorified in the assembly of your saints. The glorious company of apostles praise you. The noble fellowship of prophets praise you. The white-robed army of martyrs praise you. We, your holy Church, acclaim you. In communion with angels and archangels, and with all who served you on earth and worship you now in heaven, we raise our voice to proclaim your glory, for ever praising you and saying:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with Athanasius and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.
