

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span,
enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance?
Who has directed the spirit of the Lord, or as his counsellor has instructed him?
Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice?
Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding?
Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales;

see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering. # Sermon

All too often, we are lazy and think we have achieved the impossible and decide who God is and what He's like. We've 'put God in a box'. But God is vast—indeed, infinite—so any idea, image, or notion of God is automatically too small. You cannot put the Atlantic into a small shoe box ... the box is smaller than the ocean; similarly, the infinity of God cannot be housed within a human mind. He is too big; we are too small. His thoughts are too big to be our thoughts, and his ways are too big to be our ways. Our God is too small, simplistic, often wrpong.

But this isn't just playing with words and concepts. It's important, because Scripture tells us to love the Lord our God with all our heart, all our souls, all our strength and all our mind. More than that, the God we are bringing before people must be credible: if we live and share the wrong idea of God than why should others believe in Him?

Today, we start the longest of all the church's many seasons, Trinity, which continues until the end of October. During this season, our Bible readings act as a kind of syllabus (or 'catechism') to describe the basics of the Christian faith. And straightaway, at its extreme beginning—Trinity Sunday itself, today—that teaching starts by describing God Himself.

When a builder builds anything, they should start with the foundations. If they start elsewhere (with a bedroom or bathroom, a roof or chimney) the whole edifice will crash to earth, or everything else built on it will crack then fail. Building on poor foundations never works. That's why the foundations are sometimes more costly than the rest of the structure. And notice how they always take ages: when looking at the progress at a building site, it can look like nothing is happening but disaster will follow if the builders cut corners or rush.

We see this concept of 'foundations first' everywhere: you can't learn literacy before your learn the letters of the alphabet and their sounds; you can't learn numeracy until you understand a little about numbers. It's the same with our faith.

All Christians need a faith with foundations capable of supporting everything we place on them. As Christians, that faith must therefore support the big concepts. We need to ask first, 'Who is God and what's He like? Only *then* do we respond with questions like, 'How do we live as Christians, and what does God want of us?

As we explore the foundations of Christianity, the answer must be 'God'. It's during the remainder of the long Trinity season that the church teaches the other aspects of the faith—Church, scripture, sacraments, worship—to help build us up to each become a full disciple. You can't pray to God if you don't know who God is.

Real Christianity is always about God. Therefore, as we progress through any exploration of faith, we must ask at every stage, 'Where is God in this?' or even '*is* this of God?' As we start that journey, today's Gospel helps answer the mystery of God because it's telling us how to let God to tell us about Himself. It's a short passage from the extreme end of Matthew's Gospel that describes Jesus telling his disciples to go into the whole world and baptise. The important point is not the aspect of baptism as initiation but what happens in the baptism itself.

In baptism, we invite the Holy Spirit into a human soul. At baptism, a human soul is filled with God; and the God who resides in that soul starts to tell the person of Himself. That's why the old name for a baptism is 'Christening', from *Christos,* 'to fill or anoint'—it points to the filling and indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

That's why, straight after baptism, the person feels their mind drawn toward God because God wants them to change. If you want an analogy, it's like those oldfashioned radio sets with a large tuning dial on their front: God is retuning the soul for better reception. God is changing us from the inside out so that we can know Him better.

In the book of Jeremiah, there is a wonderful prophecy describing all of this. It's in chapter 31:

<sup>31</sup> "The days are coming," declares the Lord,

"when I will make a new covenant

with the people of Israel

and with the people of Judah.

<sup>32</sup> It will not be like the covenant

I made with their ancestors

when I took them by the hand

to lead them out of Egypt,

because they broke my covenant,

though I was a husband to them,"

declares the Lord.

<sup>33</sup> "This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel

after that time," declares the Lord.

"I will put my law in their minds

and write it on their hearts.

I will be their God,

and they will be my people.

<sup>34</sup> No longer will they teach their neighbour,

or say to one another, 'Know the LORD,'

because they will all know me,

from the least of them to the greatest,"

declares the Lord.

"For I will forgive their wickedness

and will remember their sins no more."

God gives us His Spirit to kick-start this long process: God forgives our sins in order for us to become pure; God makes us pure in order that we can know Him; God wants us to know Him in order that we can commune with Him; and God wants us to commune with Him in order that we can enter into a relationship with Him that is everlasting and eternal.

That giving of the Spirit explains why we remember Trinity Sunday the very week after Pentecost. The first disciples were filled with the Spirit at Pentecost and subsequent believers have their first encounter with the Spirit at baptism.

Today, we're starting the long season of Trinity. It's commonly used as a time of teaching and learning the faith. That process requires foundations ... and the only foundation of worth is God Himself. In order that we truly learn who God is, God Himself wants to fill us and communicate wordlessly, spiritually, about Himself. And as He does so He communicates everything else.

# The Creed

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, the source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

All We believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

# **Eucharistic Prayer** (prayer E)

The Lord be with you

#### All and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

#### All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

#### All It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For with your only-begotten Son and the Holy Spirit you are one God, one Lord. All that you reveal of your glory, the same we believe of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, without any difference or inequality. We, your holy Church, acclaim you, Father of majesty unbounded, your true and only Son, worthy of all worship, and the Holy Spirit, advocate and guide. Three Persons we adore, one in being and equal in majesty. And so with angels and archangels, with cherubim and seraphim, we sing for ever of your glory:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Lord of all life,

help us to work together for that day

when your kingdom comes

and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.
