The Collect for the Second Sunday of Advent

O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever.

First reading

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever.

Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

Second reading

A reading from the Second Letter of St Peter

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day.

The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the

coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home. Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation. So also our beloved brother Paul wrote to you according to the wisdom given him, *2 Peter 3:8–15*

Gospel reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

All Glory to you O Lord.

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,

'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight",'

John the baptiser appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptised by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptised you with water; but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.' *Mark 1:1–8*

This is the Gospel of the Lord

All Praise to you O Christ.

Sermon

For 400 years there had been no prophet in Israel, no voice direct from God, no guidance. But there was an expectation that before the coming of God's Kingdom there would be a voice crying in the wilderness, a figure either like Elijah or Elijah himself (the greatest remembered prophet).

A voice crying out

And now one appears. Out in the Jordan valley a figure comes that causes a storm of interest and crowds come out to hear this new voice from God. Like Elijah he comes in ordinary if not poor dress and eats the food of a poor man. Not distinguished in dress or appearance. Not setting himself up in fancy surroundings or among the wealthy and significant. And he certainly doesn't affirm or agree with the leaders of the people.

John the Baptist is a great Jewish hero, with a message of hope to a conquered people, popular and sought after. Yet he is totally eclipsed in our thinking by the One who comes after him.

The Kingdom of God is near.

A voice that speaks to the powerful

Like Elijah, John is not afraid of challenging the powerful. For Elijah his spiritual enemies were the prophets of Baal, and his political one's Ahab and Jezebel.

In Matthew's record we hear what John thought of the Pharisees and teachers of the Law. Out they come with the crowds to experience and critique what John is saying. Coming in their finery and in pride at their own status and learning. 'You brood of vipers!' We can imagine how they were behaving from the many examples of them trying to trip Jesus up with trick questions. He has none of this and indeed his message has no place for the status quo, for those who would hold people to keeping the law or the rituals.

He also has no time for Herod and his family. Those who lead the people but are not truly of the people of God. Like Ahab and Jezebel they bring foreign religion to bear and behave abominably. You could say John lost his head over it but he never lost his sense of God's truth and the need for a prophet to challenge the powerful.

A voice that turned spiritual understanding upside down

What was so radical and shocking about the message John brought? What shook people was the call of John to not rely on being born Jewish. The natural understanding was—I am a Jew therefore I'm part of God's people and his future plans. His call was that to truly be part of God's people you've got to commit in and the mark of this was repentance demonstrated by submitting to baptism. This was radical and shocking—apart from the different category of ceremonial washing the

main use of baptism was to welcome Gentiles who wanted to become Jews into the people, baptism as a border between the past and the future, between what I was and what I am now. So I was outside God's people now I am inside.

And the crowds rush to commit, to belong, to become. But all the time John is saying that this is not all, there is more to come indeed there is One to come who is so far greater than himself that you'd never believe it without seeing. And Jesus comes.

Lessons for us

Being born into a Christian nation/Christian family means nothing without SURREN-DERING to God's call

Being sorry is not enough: we are called to COMMIT our lives to God's Kingdom. But above all, more than any ritual or choice we need desperately to MEET WITH JESUS and receive the blessing of his presence and life by the Spirit.
