A reading from the Second Book of Samuel

When [King David] was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you.'

But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: 'Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord, "Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

All **Glory to you O Lord.**

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.'

Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.'

Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her. *Luke 1:26-38*

Sermon

May I speak in the name of our living god who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen. An angel is literally a messenger, and this angel, Gabriel was sent by God to Mary with a message, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, Jesus. God will give him the throne of David, he will reign over the house of Jacob and his kingdom will have no end... wow that is good news right... well for us listening to the story now yes, this is the news we long for, even if we don't always know it, this is the

answer to all our prayers. This is what we've been waiting for, this is the news of Jesus, the one who saves, he is Emmanuel, God with us, the fulfilment of all God's promises. The one who makes God known and enables us to share in God's kingdom. The one who will lift up the lowly, feed the poor, comfort those who mourn, confront injustice, stand up to the abuse of power, heal the sick, raise the dead. The one who wipes away the consequence of our sin and brings life in all its fullness and offers us the hope of eternity.

Jesus ... this is the news of Jesus, the one, who is 'good news'.

I'm not sure, though, that the announcement of the birth of this child felt, at the time like good news to Mary. Mary, we're told was perplexed and afraid and unsure, this was unsettling and overwhelming. This news was going to lead to all kinds of trouble, her fiancé would look to break their engagement, she'd have to give birth far away from home, she'd become a refugee to keep this child safe, she'd struggle to adjust to the fulfilment of his calling, she would be scorned by her community, brought into conflict with her other children, she would see this child betrayed, tortured and executed. He would be the cause of her very soul pierced with grief. But, we discover that her faith, Mary's incredible faith was generous, she accepted the extraordinary call of God on what was her actually very ordinary life. The hope of Israel found its place in her courage. Mary's love of God made flesh in her was truly life-giving, because it turned out that Jesus coming was 'good news'. It was good news for her fiancé Joseph, who discovered his own vocation in it. It was good news for Elizabeth, who found the peace and confirmation she needed to face her own belated parenthood. It was good news for the isolated, excluded shepherds who found comfort and joy in it. It was good news for the educated, privileged Wise Men, who discovered greater purpose and the focus for the right use of all their resources. Jesus coming was good news for fishermen, tax collectors, and royal officials, for soldiers and judges and priests, for widows and businesswomen, and sex workers. Jesus was good news for Israel, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Well, I'm not sure about good news this year: there seems to have been a great deal of bad news, we have observed unthinkable war and violence. Seen poverty and social inequality sore. Inflation went through the roof causing us to struggle to make ends meet and feed our families. We have been overstretched and become weary and despondent and viewed from here, in the midst of a rainy December, this year seems dark and dismal.

So, I pray today that the news of the coming of Christ is good news for us. I pray we find comfort and joy in this Christmas, the message to Mary was good news and God's message to us echoes that which Mary brought... Jesus is good news for all.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to Mary and he came to her and said greetings favoured one the lord is with you. Hearing the message asks of us what was asked of Mary will you bear Jesus for the world? Will you share the faith, hope and love you have found in him in the midst of this uncertainty, anxiety and fear? Will you, like Mary say here am I, the servant of the Lord and become the bearer of good news for all? When we say yes to that, we bear good news in the witness of our lives every day and everywhere. We do that in the faithfulness of our prayer and worship as we're moulded lifelong by the grace of scripture and the sacrament. We do that in our love for one another even, perhaps especially in our disagreements. By the gentle work of the spirit in us and among us we do that by our sacrificial service of the poor, the lonely, the hungry, the outcast, in our care for the vulnerable, in our determination to tackle injustice, in our grateful stewardship of creation, we do that by being rooted in Christ Jesus and shaped by him. By becoming humbler, simpler and bolder for his sake, like Mary we have been given this message the saviour of the world is coming, and we too are called to bear it in our lives, the one who is good news for all.

This Christmas Eve, let us pray, Heavenly Father who chose the blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of the promised Saviour, fill us your servants with your grace that in all things we may embrace your holy will and with her rejoice in your salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
